

chair of the Tompkins County Democratic Committee, failed to pass a motion to allow proxies to be counted, and without the 12 proxies, a quorum was not met.

Kopko also alleges that he was “improperly excluded” from the executive session of the committee at the meeting, despite him being a board of elections elected member and registered Democrat.

late for there to be a primary election. At a forum for the three candidates in August, Kopko said the move was deliberate. In the lawsuit, Kopko reiterates that point, stating Wilkinson “upon information and belief, did this in an effort to shoehorn her deputy, Andrew Bonavia, into the candidacy. That act disenfranchised the voters of Tompkins Coun-

ty for their candidate at a primary election.”

In response to the lawsuit, Stein said Kopko's claims are not true.

“These charges simply have no validity. They are a diversion which only consumes time and money. I am very disappointed in Ed Kopko's inability to lose a legitimate vote graciously,” Stein said.

The lawsuit was filed

Friday in the Supreme Court of Tompkins County. Kopko asks the court to challenge the committee's nomination and invalidate the results of the vote.

“I believe this action is necessary to maintain the integrity and fairness of the electoral process,” Kopko said in a statement. “When 144 committee members are authorized to make the decision for thousands of Tompkins County voters, the process must be followed precisely. In this case it was not.”

6th Judicial District of New York, ruled Friday the video should be released if Jacobson is willing to pay for the redaction of the video.

In an email to The Ithaca Journal on Monday, Jacobson said ICSD had not yet provided the cost of redacting the videos.

According to the ruling, the redaction would be completed in a way that blurs the student's faces, eliminates any reference to names or other factual information that would directly identify a student, and allows their words to remain clearly audible while altering their voices to be “slightly muffled or obscured.”

Following the ruling,

the district released this statement:

Following a presentation by Bassim Tamimi at the Beverly J. Martin Elementary School last year, the Ithaca City School District received a series of FOIL requests from William Jacobson, author of the legalinsurrection.com website. The district responded by providing hundreds of pages of documents. The district declined to produce video footage of the event itself taken by a community member because the video contained the voices and faces of the

district's third grade students. Instead, the district provided Mr. Jacobson with a transcript of the video. Other records were withheld or redacted in order to protect the confidentiality of students, community members, and district personnel. For example, although the district provided Mr. Jacobson with the substance of the written complaints it received regarding the Tamimi appearance, following consultation with the Committee on Open Government, it redacted the names and contact information of the complaining individuals in or-


der to preserve their privacy. In April 2016, Mr. Jacobson filed a petition seeking disclosure of the undisclosed records and removal of all redactions.


Since the original complaint was filed Sept. 19, 2015, ICSD has paid Syracuse law firm Bond, Schoeneck & King, PLLC \$20,743 in fees and litigation expenses related to Jacobson's FOIL requests to the district, including \$9,300 related to an earlier petition brought by Jacobson against both the Ithaca City School District and the Ithaca Teachers Association.

According to a statement from ICSD, the district's consultation with the firm prior to December 2015 was billed within the district's \$7,500 per month flat fee arrangement with the firm.
